1 Timothy 3: 1 - 7

"Here is a trustworthy saying: Whoever aspires to be an overseer desires a noble task. (2 Now the overseer is to be above reproach, faithful to his wife, temperate, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, (3) not given to drunkenness, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. (4) He must manage his own family well and see that his children obey him, and he must do so in a manner worthy of full[a] respect. (5) (If anyone does not know how to manage his own family, how can he take care of God's church?) (6) He must not be a recent convert, or he may become conceited and fall under the same judgment as the devil. (7) He must also have a good reputation with outsiders, so that he will not fall into disgrace and into the devil's trap".

Background -

- The Office of the Ministry is the highest office in the Church. In fact, it is the only office that God has established for every congregation (See Acts 20:28 and 1 Tim 5:17)
- ❖ When it comes to governing a church, there is not the perfect church model.
- **Every pastor is an elder. Not every elder is a pastor.**
- ❖ 1Tim 3:1 When Paul talks about the responsibility of overseers he's talking overseers of the Church. Some translations use the word bishop or elder. This is someone who is assigned the responsibility of overseeing, of watching, and of intently caring for God's church.
- Think about this. Zion Lutheran is God's bride. This is His church and so God called Pastor Mavis and the elders to help oversee and to help care for the flock.
- "Christ is not only the one who authorizes the office and calls men to service but also serves as the paradigm for those whom He calls and sends". Look at John 20:21.

- ❖ Paul wants the congregations to call as their pastors only men (adult males) who have the proper qualifications. A pastor should, first of all, be a devout Christian and have a good character and reputation. The virtues that are required of all Christians should be especially noticeable in pastors, because they are to serve as good examples to their flocks. If their conduct is bad, people will not be inclined to listen to their message.
- ❖ A pastor should, therefore, keep himself under control and not allow himself to be ruled by sinful habits, such as intemperance, bad temper, greed, or pride.
- ❖ If he is married and has children, he should conduct his home in an exemplary Christian manner and lead his family to live a pure and godly life.

Question 6 – In **Titus 1:6-9**, Paul outlines specific qualities that those who oversee a congregation must possess. What are they?

- ❖ In Chapter 3 of 1st Timothy, Paul outlines the 15 qualifications needed to be an overseer or elder. There are another 12 qualifications in Paul's letter to Titus.
- ❖ There are a total of 27 qualifications to be an elder
- ❖ As we look at the traits it doesn't mean you get to violate these things because they are only for pastors. We should be living these kinds of qualifications as Christians in general

Qualifications for Elders (1 Tim. 3:1-7)

- 1. Above Reproach Free from scandal
- 2. Husband of one Wife
- 3. Temperate
- 4. Self-Controlled
- 5. Respectable
- 6. Hospitable
- 7. Able to teach (James 3:1 and Acts 17:11)
- 8. Not given to drunkenness
- 9. Not violent but gentle
- 10. Not quarrelsome
- 11. Not a lover of money
- 12. Manages his own family well
- 13. See that his children obey him
- 14. Not a recent convert
- 15. Has a good reputation with outsiders (Luke 6:26)

Final thought

- New converts become mature enough to serve in a leadership role by learning from mature believers. A mature Christian must take a new convert under their wing and "show them the ropes." The are more new believers who desire a relationship than there are mature believers willing to give of their time.
